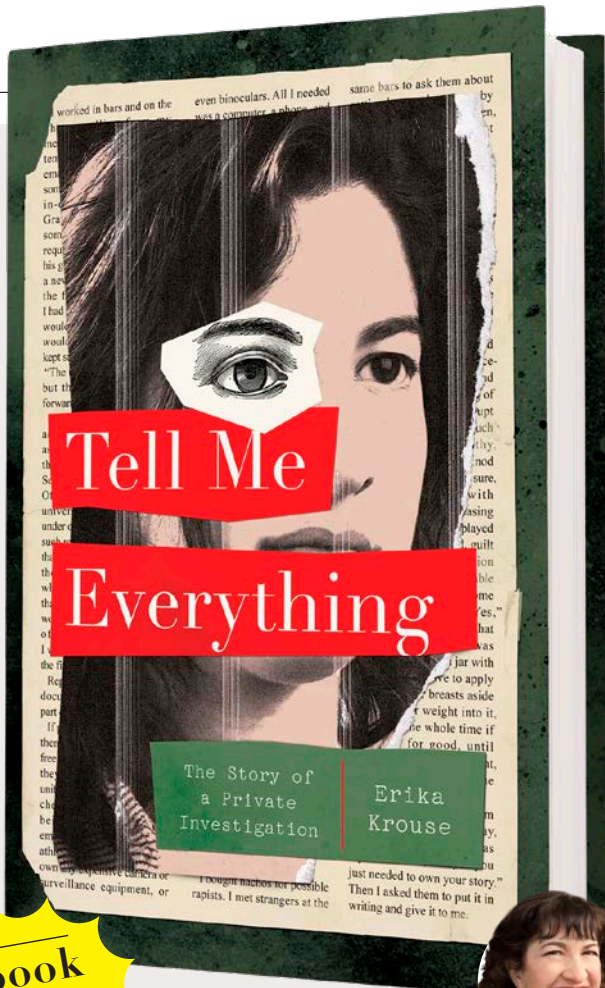

In this riveting true-crime memoir, former PI Krouse reveals how her own childhood abuse led to her role as an investigator in a landmark Title IX sexual-assault case targeting the University of Colorado's win-at-any-cost football program, where recruits often went unpunished for sexual crimes and blame fell on victims. Krouse's fight for justice (there was a \$2.85 million settlement from the university in 2007) shows how we can truly enact change—in society and in ourselves.
